THE CENTRE

The Heritage & Information Centre, on State Highway 39, offers information to visitors about Pirongia and its district. Advice is available about places to visit and things to do.

A variety of displays tell the story of the settlement from its military beginnings to the present day. They include artifacts, and the stories of local families, institutions and the changing landscape.

Information may be obtained about visiting a number of historic sites, including the East Redoubt and the Armed Constabulary Redoubt which the Historic Places Trust describes as the best preserved redoubt in the country. Each is within easy walking distance.

Particular attention is paid to Mount Pirongia which dominates the landscape. The mountain was of great significance to the original Maori occupants of the area and today provides outstanding recreational opportunities.

HISTORIC SITE

A most significant event in our history, took place in Pirongia on 11th July 1881, when King Tawhiao met Major Mair to declare peace, with a symbolic laying down of arms. This took place on the roadway outside the present Alexandra Hotel.

THE BUILDING

The Pirongia Heritage & Information Centre, Te Whare Taonga O Ngaa Rohe O Arekahanara, occupies the former St Saviour's Church, located in Franklin Street.

St Saviour's was built in 1901 as an Anglican Church, on the site of the Armed Constabulary Redoubt in Bellot Street, where it served the local congregation until 1959 when the present Anglican Church was built.

In 1960, the old church was removed to Waikeria where it served an inter-denominational congregation at the prison settlement until 1999 when it was deconsecrated and returned to its present site in Pirongia.

The building was refurbished by prisoners from Waikeria and opened as a Visitor Centre in 2003.

The initiative of the Pirongia community and those who preserved the building were publicly recognized in awards by the Waipa District Council in 2003 and the New Zealand Historic Places Trust in 2006.


















- 9. Te Ngahere Conservation Reserve. A park layout of many native plants endemic to the Pirongia area.
